## ADJECTIVES FOLLOWED BY PREPOSITIONS

A number of adjectives take certain specific prepositions after them, to be connected to the nouns or noun phrases that are objects of the prepositions.

Ex.— (i) The child was afraid of policemen.

(ii) He was greedy for money.

(iii) Line AB is parallel to line CD.

Here are some more examples of commonly used adjective + preposition combinations. The specific objects given after the prepositions are only examples.
